Text 1
Present Simple Tense

Structure: S + V1 (s/es)

Definition: We use the present simple to talk about repeated actions or events, permanent states or things which are always true. To find out more about the present simple, read and listen to the conversation below.

Examples:

- ♦ I usually get up at 7 o'clock.
- ♦ During the week I have swimming practice on Mondays, I do taekwondo on Tuesdays and tennis on Thursdays.
- ♦ We always go on holiday in the summer.

* The main thing is that the third person singular forms end in **-s or -es**.
That's for **he, she or it**.

Examples:

- ♦ He watches black and white films at his cinema club on Wednesdays.
- ♦ He thinks chess is a sport!

** For **questions** we use:
do/does + subject + infinitive without to.....?

Examples:

- ♦ Do you see him on Wednesdays then?
- ♦ Does Jack like sports?

*** For **negatives** we use:
the subject + do/does + not + infinitive without to.

Examples:

- ♦ Daisy and Jack don't go out together much at the weekend.
- ♦ I don't think Coldplay are boring.

Text 2 Adverbs of Frequency
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Definition: We use adverbs of frequency – like sometimes or usually – to say how often we do things, or how often things happen.

100%						0%
always	usually / normally	often	sometimes	occasionally	hardly / ever	never

Examples:

- ◆ They always hang out together.
- ◆ The Northern Lights are usually green.
- ◆ You normally see them best in September or March.
- ◆ It's often cloudy.

Q: What do you notice about the position of the adverbs?

A: They are usually before the main verb, or between the auxiliary and the main verb. But they come after the verb to be.
